

Purpose of the DE&I Section

June Observances and Events

<u>Alzheimer's and Brain Awareness Month</u>. Learn more about treatments and real progress being made for families and more than 55 million people living with Alzheimer's or another dementia throughout the month. Raise awareness by wearing purple on June 21, the summer solstice, which is the longest day of the year to shed light on Alzheimer's and brain related illnesses.

<u>Men's Health Month</u> Men are significantly less likely to visit a doctor than women. June is designated as a time for men to take charge of their health. Encourage the men in your lives to visit a primary care provider and to obtain regular health screenings.

National Safety Month From workplaces or anyplace, keep safety a priority. Use the month of June to review, prepare and anticipate safety to prevent worked-related injuries and illnesses.

<u>Post-Traumatic Stress Disorder (PTSD) Awareness Month</u> PTSD can occur long after the initial traumatic event. Explore the research that is developing better tools to identify those at highest risk of the disorder, as well as new and better treatments.
